




- PACS (GE Centricity)
  - App running on dedicated radiology workstations
  - Lite version able to run on non-workstation computers via <u>myapps.partners.org</u>
  - Lists



- PACS (GE Centricity)
  - Mark as dictated, oracle, sticky note
  - Put back on list
  - Assign to different list
  - Exam viewing history (open API)



- PACS (GE Centricity)
  - Windowing
    - Number pad settings (1 soft, 2 lung, 3 liver, 4 bone, 5 brain, 7 vascular/PE)
    - How to set number pad settings
      - Soft tissue (W: 400, L: 30-50)
      - Abdomen (W: 400, L: 50)
      - Liver (W: 150, L: 30)
      - Lung/Free air (W: 1500, L: -600)
      - Mediastinum (W: 350, L: 50)
      - Bone (W: 1800, L:400)
      - Brain (W: 80, L:40)
      - Stroke (W: 40, L: 40)

#### PowerScribe 360

- Reporting app
- Can be accessed from non-workstation computers via myapps.partners.org
- Templates, harmonization
- Color scheme and font
- Drafts, assigning attendings
- Viewing old reports
- Opening ANCR shortcut
- ANCR (Alert Notification of Critical Results)
  - BWH web-based critical result reporting system to either Ordering or Responding Clinician
  - Red, orange, yellow, purple (WAL)
  - Launch from PowerScribe (synced with internet browser)

- Patient lists for responding clinician
- Search function
- Note filter (Op notes, etc)
- Protocoling
- New radiology palette (BWH/MGH)
- Protocoling, contrast contraindications, reactions, and prep

- How to save images/cine clips for presentations
  - Images
  - "Clipping Tool" application (screen shot) on nearly all PACS computers
  - Cines
    - Video recording option in PowerPoint (Insert > video)
      - Can only create cine in PowerPoint on PC, but will then work on PC and Mac
    - Auto-scrolling tool in PACS allows smooth cine clips

### ABR Fees

- Annual ~\$600 fee
- Reimbursed by book fund
- Pay by October-ish to avoid late fee (email notification)

### In-service Exam

- Annual nationwide exam in January
- Not reflective of ABR core exam
- Do NOT study for it

### **Emergency Radiology**


- First floor of 75 Francis Street. The reading room is inside the Emergency Room. Email Julie to ask for badge access to the ED.
- Monday-Friday, 11am 10pm, Sunday 9am-9pm Rotation starts on a Monday and ends on Sunday
  - If there are two residents hours are slightly different Monday-Friday 11am-10pm or 1pm-11pm then Sunday 9am-8pm or 11am-10pm - exact schedule will be on amion.
- You will also have additional ED Saturday shifts (about 7 shifts) 9am-9pm spread between first and second year.
- Read plain films, CT, US
- Protocol
- Phone calls
- Monitor trauma panscans, stroke CTAs, and dissection studies at the scanner; an attending or fellow will do the first few with you

### Nuclear Medicine


- L1 Nuclear Medicine reading room
- Hours: 8:30AM 5:30/6PM
- Gamma camera exams
  - Bone scans, thyroid, gastric emptying, HIDA, MAG3 renal
  - SPECT low-dose CT for localization of lesions on gamma camera
- PET-CTs
  - FDG-PET (F18)
  - Dotatate (Ga68) neuroendocrine tumors
- Hermes software
  - Dedicated workstations for interpretation
  - Load PET and CT images with cross-referencing
  - Measuring SUV (standardized uptake values)







- L2 Cardiovascular Imaging reading room (8:30AM 5:30PM-ish)
- Work with cardiology imaging fellow (cardiology) to get histories and indications for the day's exams
- Read out in the afternoon with Cardiology attending
- Nuclear stress tests, PET perfusion, Cardiac PET viability study, PYP amyloid
