RAD-PATH GUIDELINES 2020 – 2021

- Conferences occur on assigned dates from 12:15-1:15PM.
- All Conferences will occur virtually via Zoom until further notice (link will be emailed prior to the conference)
- Conferences will contain both case-based segments and didactic components. The didactic portion may be
 integrated into the presentation after each case or can be given after all of the cases. Corresponding
 pathology should be presented and discussed by the pathology resident after each case.
- Per ACGME "Milestones" requirements, presentations must incorporate ACR Appropriateness Criteria and Multiple Choice Questions (Audience Response System use, such as Poll Everywhere, is encouraged).
- The minimum number of cases is 4, but 5 is preferred. Cases should share a common theme. In rare instances, 4-5 GREAT cases without a unifying theme can be shown.
- Cases must be from the past 5 years (1-2 years ideal).
- Pathology resident should be contacted at least 4 weeks prior to the conference.
- Pathology needs to be from the same patient as the imaging.
- For the pathology residents, please keep last minute case changes to a minimum.
- Gross pathology should be included on as many cases as possible.
- Cases must be discussed with Dr. Angela Giardino 2 weeks before conference either in person or via email.
- Cases must be sent out by email as "unknowns" at least 3 days prior to the conference.
- Appropriate staff, depending on the conference theme, should be invited to attend conference (e.g., for supratentorial tumor conference, invite Neuro staff to participate).
- All presentations will be saved and made available online to BWH radiology residents.
- List of responsible residents and dates will be provided by the chief residents.
